# A Message from the Head of School and President

The 2012-2013 school year was one of the most exciting in school history. The year began with the opening of our new playground, an outdoor play facility that was identified as a critical need for our Early Childhood Program. Along with a \$100,000 anonymous gift, the leadership of Chayim Dimont, our Lower School Principal, and Board Member Rachel Tripp, was instrumental in bringing our long-awaited Aunt Jessie's Playground to fruition, by raising an additional \$150,000. This new facility provides our students in early childhood through fourth grade with one of the premier playgrounds in Palm Beach County.

Technology was another area of tremendous growth as the school purchased 75 new iPads to support a number of new curriculum initiatives. Rabbi Mordechai Smolarcik developed a comprehensive TOSHBA (Talmud/Gemara) curriculum that utilizes the iPad to teach Gemara. The use of iPads engages students in the study of esoteric texts and makes the material presented engaging and relevant. Rabbi Smolarcik's pioneering work was rewarded by a \$50,000 grant presented by the Mayberg Family Charitable Foundation, one of only two projects so honored nationally. The grant enables Rabbi Smolarcik to recruit educators from across the world to contribute content and to collaborate in producing interactive mini textbooks for use with the iPad. The work being done here at Hillel is transformative in nature and makes Hillel Day School a leader in using technology and 21st century skills in teaching Torah to students.

The use of technology is not limited to Middle School TOSHBA classes, however. The 75 newly purchased iPads are

stored in three portable storage units that make regular rounds, moving from classroom to classroom throughout the school. Under the direction of our Educational Technology Director, iPads are now an ubiquitous learning tool available to teachers and students.

The second trimester brought with it the visiting committee from the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. The committee spent three days on campus, interviewing parents, students, teachers, administration and members of the Board as well as visiting fifteen classrooms. The committee recommended continuing the school's accreditation for an additional five years

and gave the school high grades for effectively engaging students in learning. Teachers were commended for their effectiveness in instruction.

The school's music program was also significantly enhanced. Students in fourth and fifth grades now receive regular instruction on the instrument of their choice and a school band was formed. The years ahead show great promise for music education as current fourth and fifth graders move through the middle school grades.

Of significant note is the opening of Camp Ruach, Hillel's newly established summer day camp. In its inaugural year,

the camp was an outstanding success, providing over 260 campers with a stellar camp program.

Hillel students were exposed to a wide range of exciting and variegated learning experiences over the year. Speakers in middle school included Congressman Ted Deutch; Penina Taylor, a former activist in the Hebrew/Christian community who now speaks of the tremendous transformation in her life becoming an Orthodox Jewish woman; Alan Veingrad, ex-NFL star and inspirational speaker; Leslie Schwartz, who produced a movie about his Holocaust experiences: Irwin Stovroff, a WWII Prisoner of War; and Crys Soderholm, the artist who created the magnificent stained glass windows that adorn our Beit Midrash

Our students read almost a quarter of a million pages in our first annual Read to Succeed Read-a-Thon and our campus was transformed into a colonial village as, at Thanksgiving, students studied the various aspects of colonial life. Hillel was named a Green School of Promise for its work in improving the ecology of our campus. The Bracha Bowl helped students familiarize themselves with the correct berachot for all occasions. Who can forget

"Hege" (AKA Rabbi Eisenberger) and "Phin" (AKA Rabbi Drang) as they made their appearance to introduce this year's Bracha Bowl. If you missed it you can access it on HillelTube.

We thank G-d for His abundant blessing in making this the best year yet as Hillel strives to "create America's best Jewish day school."

# A Message from Financial Resource Development

We want to wish you all a Shana Toya and a year filled with good health and happiness. This Annual Report provides you with an overview of the past fiscal year at Hillel Day School of Boca Raton. Our Honor Roll, listed on pages 6 and 7, recognizes Annual Campaign gifts made to the school of \$500 or greater during the 2012-2013 academic year. These contributions provide the essential scholarship funds necessary to educate children of our community who would otherwise be unable to receive a quality Jewish education, as well as allows Hillel Day School to continue to maintain standards of excellence in all aspects of its educational programming. This past summer a new donor recognition display was installed in the school lobby. This beautiful new display recognizes donors who have given to the Annual Campaign, as well as designated gifts, our grandparent society donors, and philanthropic and endowment funds earmarked for the Annual Campaign. In addition, our three major gift societies, the Lamed Vav Society (\$36,000+), the Chai Society (\$18,000+), and the brand new Maimonides Society (\$5,000 annually for minimum 3 years), are prominently displayed to thank those pillars of our community who have made Hillel Day School and its students a priority with their generous tzedakah. The new donor wall leaves room for the growth of our campaign over the years. In addition, Capital Campaign donors are recognized prominently in a separate display in the lobby of the middle school building.



This past year our Inaugural Journal Dinner Dine-Out recognized Oht Hameseroot recipients Rabbi Samuel J. Levine and Barbara Rose for 13 years of service to the school. In addition, faculty members Jo Felman, Dianne Groendyke and Ellen Nadler were wished well on their retirement. Donors who joined the Tribute Committee were able to place an ad in the Journal, as well as receive a dine-out gift card to a local kosher restaurant of their choice. Our other major fundraising event of the year, the Annual Golf Tournament and Raffle, co-chaired by Ted Struhl and Michael Zimmerman, was held in May 2013 (see page 10 for a complete recap).

Other successes for the year included the first full year of the Koppie Cohn Day of Learning Program, endowed in memory of Menashe Koppel Cohn, A'H, by his parents, Naomi & Todd Cohn, and his siblings, Eli Meir, Leora and

Tamar. This ongoing program was a tremendous success, raising over \$11,000.

Hillel Day School received a grant funded by the Legacy Heritage Fund in conjunction with the Partnership for Excellence in Jewish Education (PEJE) for its Leadership and Fundraising Academy (LFA). The LFA is designed to advance a school's financial sustainability by creating a holistic development effort that combines best practices in governance, professional leadership and fundraising. The initiative's 18-month curriculum engages key administrative staff and lay leaders in communal workshops and individualized coaching. The result is transformative cultural change toward sustainable financial growth.

Finally we would like to thank our Campaign Chairs for their time and dedication in fundraising: Major Gifts Chair Daniel Katz, Maimonides Society Chair Dr. Benjamin Freedman, Annual Golf Tournament Co-Chairs Ted Struhl and Michael Zimmerman, Dor L'Dor Grandparent Society Chair Helen Cohan, Every Parent Campaign Chair Gila Stern, Create a Jewish Legacy Campaign Co-Chairs Glen Golish and Leigh Katzman, and Jeremy Lurie for his help with the Annual Raffle and coupon booklet.




# Hillel Day School Giving Overview


programs such as color war, twice-weekly trips, and an amazing end-of-summer carnival
