HDS combines a rich and inspiring Judaic studies curriculum

A new Siddur for young students is being used which emphasizes the understanding and connection that will lead to greater lifelong commitment to and appreciation of daily prayer. Our older students heard from great Jewish thinkers/heroes like Rabbi Lord Jonathan Sacks, Yosef Mendelevitch, the famous refusenik from the former Soviet Union and Rachelle Fraenkel. the mother of Naftali, one of the three boys murdered by terrorists last summer in Israel. These same students also participated in an organized campaign to buy Israeli goods at local stores to combat the unfortunate efforts of those that cause harm to our beloved homeland. Our EMET (Excellent Middot Every Time) and KAR<sup>2</sup>E (Kindness Always, Respect and Responsibility Everywhere) programs continue to evolve and teach our students the importance of outstanding character and behavior. And finally, who and what we honored this past year at our annual dinner made an incredibly loud statement as to what Hillel Day School is all about. We honored eight teachers for either 13 or 26 years of service and we highlighted the impressive extent of our school-

## A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

At Hillel, we are committed to excellence and constantly looking for ways to improve. Although this focus tends to have us always looking ahead, our annual report is a great exercise for us to take a step back and reflect on our achievements over the past year.

Just before the start of the 2014/15 school

year, we had the privilege of hosting the JCC Maccabi Games and JCC Cares chesed program on our campus. It gave us an opportunity to showcase Hillel Day School to an international audience, and the feedback we received was overwhelmingly positive.

Over the past year, we implemented the security enhancements that had been subsidized by our Department of Homeland Security grant. In addition to those projects, we invested in additional security upgrades and trainings, and added a full-time School Resource Officer to complement our existing 24/7 security presence.

In an effort to keep tuition stable over the past 3 years in the face of rising costs, we have found ways to reduce operating expenses in a way that still enables us to enhance our facilities and academic and extracurricular opportunities. Among our efforts, are investments in various systems that have added

operating efficiencies and lowered costs. DDC, our school information system has streamlined our admissions, registration, medical, grading, and communication systems. HotLunchOnline has offered convenience and accountability to our business office, as well as to families participating in our daily hot lunch program. We have recently implemented the MaintenanceDirect application, which has revolutionized our facilities maintenance systems. Very shortly, we will be introducing its sister program, FSDirect, a facilities scheduling component that will continue to add efficiency, organization, and accountability to our daily operation. This past year also saw several upgrades to the FACTS platform, which manages our financial aid applications, and processes all school payments from tuition to after school activities to bussing fees and nearly everything in between.

Boruch Hashem, our enrollment has increased 17% over the past 3 school years, and Camp Ruach has grown in each of its first 3 years, necessitating upgrades and modifications to our facilities in order to accommodate the record levels of

enrollment. We pray, G-D willing, that these positive trends continue, and that we are able to offer our children the very best for many more years to come!



# A MESSAGE FROM FINANCIAL RESOURCE DEVELOPMENT

Greetings from Financial Resource Development...let's take a look back on the 2014-2015 school year which raised \$544,988.91 for Jewish education.

Our major fundraiser, the Annual Journal Dinner, was held on January 8, 2015, and honored eight faculty members (six for 13 years of service and two for 26 years of service) and Ambassador Ido Aharoni was the featured speaker as we celebrated our commitment to Israel through education (recap on page 10). The Annual Golf Tournament was re-invented and our Inaugural Parent-Child Golf Outing debuted on June 7, 2015, with a huge turnout of golfers of all ages (see page 11). We also transformed our Annual Raffle into the Mega Raffle and raised a recordbreaking \$22,820.

Our Major Gift Societies, of which \$216,000 of the year's total Annual Campaign hailed, includes donations to the Lamed Vav Society (\$36,000+), Chai Society (\$18,000+) and the Maimonides Society (\$5,000 for at least 3 consecutive years). We are grateful to our Major Gift Society donors for being pillars and role models for our children and the community (complete listing on page 8).

Our Every Parent Campaign strives for 100% participation of all families to make a donation in any amount, to the campaign. We thank those families who participated this past year through their gift of tzedakah (see page 9 for the full listing). Once again, thanks to the efforts of **Deena and Jeremy Lurie** and **Lori Landes**, the SCRIP Program, which sells popular merchant gift cards at no extra cost to the purchaser, raised over \$1,000 for HDS. The Koppie Cohn Day of Learning Program raised \$7,875 for the Scholarship Fund, and \$33,000 since its inception in April 2012. The program is endowed in memory of **Menashe Koppel Cohn**, *A'H*, by his parents, **Naomi & Todd Cohn**, and his siblings, **Eli Meir, Leora** and **Tamar**. Other ongoing programs that benefit the Scholarship Fund include general donations and tribute donations which can be made in honor of an occasion or in memory of a loved one.

Designated Gifts raised \$58,962.69 collectively. These specially earmarked gifts are crucial for many of the programs and projects that HDS implements. Donations to the ETGAR Program as well as the 6th, 7th and 8th grade class trips are some of the ways

designated gifts are utilized. We also acknowledge the Jules L. & Dorothy M. Kamsly Teen Program Grant from the Jacobson Jewish Community Foundation of the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County for a portion of funding toward the 8th grade class trip



to Israel. Additionally the Charles Scher Teacher's Discretionary Fund was initiated this past year by the **Scher family** to assist faculty in need of financial assistance. The E2K Program which develops student capabilities in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) was sponsored by **Dr. Joshua and Sara Light** in memory of Joshua's beloved father, **Dr. David Light**, z"*l*.

We also are excited to announce a new partnership with the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County and the Harold Grinspoon Foundation to develop a permanent endowment campaign through planned giving (details on page 14).

Phase II of the Capital Campaign is ongoing throughout the school year and we thank our current donors for providing a strong foundation for the future of Hillel Day School (list of dedications on page 8).






# 8TH GRADE GRADUATION By: Ilona Grynsztein
