#### DID YOU KNOW?

The last several years have been marked by a significant shift in instruction and pedagogy throughout the educational world. Classrooms used to be "one size fits all" environments where the teacher would deliver the content to the mostly passive learners. Thankfully, Judaism's most famous saying relating to education, Chanoch le'naar al pi darko, teach a child according to his/her unique

ways, is now well accepted as the ideal. Great schools now pride themselves on learning environments that are more tailored to the individual strengths and challenges of each child and emphasize critical thinking, creativity and collaboration as they engage children in meaningful learning.

KHDS is "ahead of the curve" when it comes to providing this type of educational environment and we are constantly striving to keep getting even better. Recognizing that even a family with several children enrolled in our school could never know the full extent of what is actually going on across 12 separate age levels, I would like to take this opportunity to highlight a few areas of child-centered, 21st century minded education that we are particularly proud of:

- Our Rotational Model in the early elementary grades allows for multiple levels, a low teacher to student ratio and more opportunities for creativity and deeper thinking and questioning.
- Math curriculum throughout the school has shifted towards greater understanding, problem solving and word problems that emphasize real-life situations.
- The Middle School now has a faculty member dedicated to working with individual students on academic support and organizational skills.
- All grades and subjects are more engaged with projects, inquiry-based activities and collaborative learning. It's very common to see students working in small groups in the Middle School lounge trying to "figure out" what they need to know or be able to do for their classes.
- Our wide variety of Middot programs (for character development and healthy social interactions) help children grow into respectful, kind, caring individuals. Not only is this of great value on its own, it promotes the positive culture we all need to maximize growth and learning.
- We use the E2K Science and Math Enrichment program from the Center of Initiatives in Jewish Education which provides enrichment for eligible students.
- An incredible array of after-school programs, sports opportunities and electives allow our children to explore areas of interest that may not be found during typical school hours.
- Elementary school projects and book reports are done primarily in school to ensure that the students are deeply engaged in all aspects of the learning and learn to be more independent.
- Teachers use numerous online/web-based programs that allow children to be at their exact level and promote learning and review beyond the classroom walls.
- We have harnessed the power of technology (with our hundreds of iPads and Chromebooks) to take learning to the next level with programs that are stimulating and promote the skills that the workforce of today (and tomorrow) demand.
- Our teachers and administrators are life-long learners themselves, always looking to learn new strategies and techniques that further all of the above. As an example, most teachers are involved in Professional Learning Communities within the school which means they voluntarily meet on a monthly basis with their peers to explore educational topics such as differentiated instruction, classroom culture, etc. When the teachers keep learning and growing, the students will truly get the very best!

#### **CHESED DAY**


Students in grades 1-3 participated with other local Jewish day schools in the **Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach**

#### **DON'T WORRY, BE HAPPY**

We all want the same things for our children, we want them to grow up and be happy, successful and loved. Mostly though, we want them to be happy; but how do we go about ensuring our children's happiness? Joy and happiness are

happiness? Joy and happiness are fundamental principles in our Judaism. We know that Hashem's presence can only be felt when there is joy; Torah cannot be acquired when there is a lack of joy. So, too, many of our Mitzvot and events are associated with joy-simcha.

So how do we help our children strengthen their capacity to experience joy and happiness? Research shows that children who are happy and optimistic are usually the products of happy and optimistic homes. A sure way to promote this is by helping the child feel connected—to you, other family members, friends, neighbors—the more connections the better. Keep in mind, too, that children absorb everything around them. Our own moods matter; happy parents are more likely to have happy children.

Not surprisingly, many studies link self-esteem and happiness. Praise effort, praise creativity, and praise persistence. Foster a growth mindset. Allow children to risk failure. Few skills are mastered on a first try and it is through practice that mastery is achieved. Through repeated experiences of mastery does a child develop a can-do attitude that then allows the child to approach future challenges with optimism.

Feelings of gratitude also contribute to emotional well-being. People who describe themselves as consciously cultivating gratefulness are rated as happier by those who know them, as well as by themselves. Help your child find the joy in everyday things. Studies show that people who notice small miracles of daily life, and allow themselves to be touched by them, are happier. Daily life overflows with joyful experiences; help your child learn to recognize them.

Teach the child that sometimes our greatest obstacles can become our greatest sources of growth—it all depends on our perspective. There is a famous story brought down in our tradition that occurred during Creation. All the new animals were busy testing their newfound abilities. They were flopping, running, hopping and jumping. There was one animal, however, that was limping along very frustrated. The animal cried out. Hashem comforted the animal so that he would be able to rise above other creatures. Suddenly two appendages grew out of the sides of the animal. The creature tried to walk but found

that these appendages now weighed him down. "This is even worse than before!" said the animal. Hashem replied, "Silly bird, those are wings, use them to fly."

May we all have success in raising our most precious possessions, our children!

The 5th grade took a field trip to the Gumbo Limbo Sea Turtle Rehabilitation and Nature Center where they used the outdoor laboratory to



# **BUSINESS OFFICE UPDATE** Joe Sharp, Executive Director



f you've followed the KHDS happenings of late, you've seen a lot of incredible developments. We've enjoyed record turnout and fundraising at our Annual Journal Dinner, record fundraising for our scholarship fund Mega Raffle, record Camp Ruach enrollment, record school enrollment, 4 years of stable tuition and a tuition decrease for 2017/18. Certainly, we should be proud of our accomplishments and feel a sense of satisfaction—

but just for a brief moment. All of our efforts today, and over the past 28 years, have been to ensure that KHDS is thriving 28 years from now, and beyond. That is why we are committed to continually assessing our entire operation and identifying innovative strategies to improve the KHDS product—both inside and outside of the classroom.

One may wonder why we are devoted to this mindset in the midst of such an auspicious and blessed period in our school's history, but that is precisely the point. We have been given the extraordinary gift of being able to operate from a position of strength, and we intend to build upon that foundation to ensure long-term stability. Case in point: Harvard University is arguably one of the most prestigious universities in the world and is perennially among the top few institutions in philanthropy. Despite that, they recently charged themselves to raise the bar again with a record-breaking \$7 billion campaign. As Harvard President Drew Faust stated, "We launch The Harvard Campaign at a moment when higher education is being challenged to reinvent itself, and we embrace this opportunity for a campaign that aims to do more than merely extend or reinforce long-standing strength and eminence. The Harvard Campaign calls on us to articulate and affirm the fundamental values and purposes of higher education in a world transformed by globalization and technology, a world filled with promise for improving human lives, a world in which talent recognizes no boundaries, and in which creativity and curiosity will fuel the future." Our goals at KHDS, too, are so clearly expressed in that statement. There should be no room for complacency so long as there are ways to improve upon your child's KHDS experience, and as long as tuition affordability remains at the forefront of the issues facing our community.

Through the efforts of Teach Florida/OU Advocacy and Agudath Israel of Florida, we are fortunate to have access to programs such as Step Up for Students, the Gardiner Scholarship, and the **McKay Scholarship**, and we are endeavoring to broaden the impact of those programs. We have been fortunate to receive Federal funds for educational and health services, technology, professional development, and campus security, but are working multiple channels to take advantage of all that is available to us that we have not yet been able to access. For example, I was fortunate to have met recently with Dr. Robert Avossa, Superintendent of Schools for Palm Beach County, to determine how we might best capitalize on the programs commonly known as 'Title' funding under the newly revised ESSA legislation.

In our recent meeting, Helen London of Prizmah remarked that just like Harvard needs to keep being Harvard, KHDS needs to keep being KHDS. Sure, we are blessed by Hashem to be in the position that we find ourselves in, but just as Harvard continues to raise their bar of expectations, so should we, at KHDS, do whatever we can to maintain and build upon all that we currently offer. We cannot simply expect to be able to 'extend or reinforce long-standing strength and eminence' and coast along from one year to the next. Rather, we must commit ourselves today, more than ever before, to perpetuate the proud legacy of Katz Hillel Day School for generations to come.




#### LEARNING THE ROPES
