A Message from the Head of School, Rabbi Samuel J. Levine



Dear Parents.

We are pleased to announce that Hillel Day School is the recipient of a \$50,000 Jewish Education Innovation Challenge Grant, which is an initiative of the Mayberg Family Charitable **Foundation**. Hillel is one of two schools nationwide to receive

this prestigious award. The grant results from the innovative work of Rabbi Mordechai Smolarcik, who, for the past two years, has been creating an iPad-based curriculum and textbook for the study of Gemara. Rabbi Smolarcik, who recently received his Psy. D. and who is an expert in the use of technology in instruction, has spent countless hours developing both a curriculum and a methodology that maximizes the acquisition of the reading and thinking skills necessary to read a page of Gemara while, concurrently, extracting the relevance from each topic studied. Smolarcik reports that a pilot project conducted at Hillel this past year showed that students retained the skills studied and also absorbed the relevant life lessons from the material covered. Most importantly, the greatest gains were observed in the affective domain, where students demonstrated significantly increased enthusiasm for the study of Gemara. an important factor if learning Gemara is to become a lifelong pursuit.

Instruction, using technology, is fast becoming the hallmark of 21st century education. School districts and publishing companies are expending massive resources to create technology-based learning It is exceedingly materials. difficult for Torah schools to keep pace with the advancements in education evolving in the secular world. It is for this reason that our work here at Hillel becomes so vital. Rabbi Smolarcik's project will recruit educators from across the world to contribute



transformed into interactive textbooks for use on the iPad. project's initial goal is to produce 40 mini-textbooks over the next two years that can be shared with other schools and students through Apple's iBook store. Phase two of the project, which is already being planned, will extend the iBook curriculum to Chumash and Navi as well.

This grant will benefit every Hillel student and, G-d willing, will enhance the Torah education of thousands of day school students around the world.

HDS RECEIVES GRANT TO PARTICIPATE IN LEADERSHIP & FUNDRAISING ACADEMY

The Partnership for Excellence in Jewish Education (PEJE) announces the awarding of a generous grant from the Legacy Heritage Fund to expand PEJE's signature Leadership and Fundraising Academy (LFA) into two new communities.

PEJE has selected South Florida, as one of the two communities, for its new Legacy Heritage Leadership and Fundraising Academy. The South Florida cohort will partner with the Center for the Advancement of Jewish Education (CAJE), a subsidiary agency of the Greater Miami Jewish Federation. The program launched on May 28.

PEJE's LFA is consistent with the mission of the Legacy Heritage Fund to support Jewish education. The LFA is designed to advance a school's financial sustainability by creating a holistic development effort that combines best practices in governance, professional leadership, and fundraising. The initiative's 18-month curriculum engages the head of school, development professional, and lay leaders in communal workshops and individualized coaching. The result is transformative cultural change towards sustainable financial growth.

"As funding sources get scarcer, it's critical for Jewish day schools to adopt a more strategic, long-term approach to achieving financial sustainability," says PEJE Executive Director, Amy Katz. "The Leadership and Fundraising Academy will serve as a model to improve schools' capacity to engage donor support over time."

The 20 participating South Florida schools include: David Posnack Jewish Day School, Donna Klein Hebrew Academy, Gordon Schools of Beth David Congregation, Hebrew Academy (RASG), Hillel Day School of Boca Raton, Hochberg Preparatory, Jacobson Sinai Academy, Lehrman Community Day School, Scheck Hillel Community School, Temple Beth Am Day School and Toras Emes Academy.

HDS RECEIVES GRANT FOR 8TH GRADE ISRAEL TRIP

Hillel Day School received a grant for its 8th grade graduation trip to Israel. The grant, funded by the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County and the Jacobson Jewish Community Foundation through the Jules L. & Dorothy M. Kamsly Teen Program


