It was the best of the times, it was the worst of times. These famous words used by Charles Dickens to describe the era of the French Revolution also seem appropriate when it comes to the education of adolescents in today's day and age. We know more about curriculum and instruction than ever before. Our teachers are better trained. Our schools and community have incredible resources and specialized personnel. Communication between school and home has improved in quality and quantity. Yet, sadly, it has become well documented that adolescents of today are more anxious, depressed and are generally unhappier than ever before. Dr. Jean Twenge, a psychologist and expert in generational differences,

believes that this post-Millennial generation she likes to call iGen (those born between 1995 and 2012) is on the verge of a mental health crisis. Dr. Twenge asserts that the primary cause of this unfortunate trend relates to smartphone use and social media, but that analysis is beyond the scope of this article.

However, you should be encouraged in knowing that KHDS takes a whole-child approach to education to ensure that our precious children are getting the messages, values, information and tools they need to navigate this stage of life in the healthiest possible way.

Our middle school students have always benefited from our biweekly KAR²E (Kindness Always, Respect and Responsibility Everywhere) program that focuses on social/emotional health, an experienced guidance staff, teachers who recognize that their job is to teach children rather than subjects and an overall Torah atmosphere that stresses the inherent value of each individual. But the last few months have included programs led by outside professionals on topics such as digital citizenship (healthy outlook and usage of technology and social media), eating disorders, sexual abuse prevention and treating others as we want to be treated. All were informative and impactful. We should all be proud to be part of a school that takes a sophisticated, proactive approach towards preparing our students for the teenage years and beyond.

Is the Grass Really Greener on the Other Side?

Another new word that has been added to our growing lexicon is FOMO, "Fear Of Missing Out."

Chances are that if you already know the word and its meaning, you are most likely afflicted with this syndrome. Essentially, it is the feeling of anxiety that arises when one perceives that other people are having more fun, are more successful, are happier or are living more interesting lives. FOMO is not a new concept, as the need to "Keep up with the Joneses" has existed since the beginning of time. However, this condition has become far more prevalent since the advent of social media and e-commerce. We live in a time where much of our communication is delivered through posts, shared digital media, and consumer advertisements that take advantage of our insecurities. A recent study found that 68% of millennials will make reactionary purchases online often within 24 hours of seeing an object that was purchased by another member of their social network. Just by showing consumers how popular specific items are to other viewers, it creates a stronger sense of urgency to have the item, as the viewer will feel he or she is missing out if choosing not to purchase

In an age where we are constantly inundated with social media, celebrity products, social pressures, what can we do to limit our personal experience of FOMO? The most important thing we can do is actually quite simple: "The secret is to want what you have and not want what you don't have." When we believe that the grass is greener on the other side of the fence, and believe that others have the good stuff, we are taken over by greed, wanting more and more which leads to feeling that we can never have enough. We, and our children, should spend less time looking outward for validation of our personal fulfillment and spend more time looking inward. The grass, in fact, is not greener on the other side, the grass is greenest where it is watered the most; teach yourselves and your children to carry water throughout life and tend the grass wherever you are.

4th grade took a field trip to Billie Swamp Safari to learn about the Everglades.




Leadership Messages

We've made a number of facilities upgrades over the first half of the 2017/18 school year, and have several more about to begin. What makes these improvements unique to many others that have been made over the past several years, is that they are being funded mostly or in large part through grants and designated gifts.

• Although we had unfortunately sustained some damage due to Hurricane Irma, we have been able to make all of the necessary repairs and upgrades such as new perimeter fencing, new gymnasium flooring, and several other repairs through a Public Assistance grant from **FEMA**.

- We are also working with FEMA on a mitigation grant to upgrade our campus with impact windows and doors.
- We're currently enhancing our access control campus-wide thanks to funding from the State
 of Florida. This project will be in addition to the systems already being employed thanks to a
 grant from the Department of Homeland Security.
- We've been continuing to develop our new makerspace room thanks in part to generous
 grants from national foundations, including a matching grant from the Legacy Learning Labs
 Project. As part of this project, we will be adding a kiln room to our art room in the Teddy &
 Linda Struhl Elementary School, that we hope to open for the 2018/19 school year.



As KHDS stakeholders, you will be happy to know that we're making long-term investments in our campus and classrooms with little to no impact on our operating expenses. This also allowed us to announce in December that we are not increasing tuition fees for 2018/19, keeping rates at their lowest since the 2010/11 school year.

Nevertheless, the need for financial aid is as great as ever, and the KHDS Scholarship Fund awarded approximately \$1,500,000 this year to 58% of our families and nearly 300 children. It is important to note, however, that <u>our scholarship fund is not funded at all by tuition fees</u>, but it is in fact funded completely by the **State of Florida** and **Jewish Federation** scholarship funding, several revenue-generating programs, and generous gifts from people like you!

One of our newest fundraising campaigns is our **Scholarship Fund Mega Raffle**, which just concluded another successful campaign. This campaign has raised over \$50,000 this year, and has grown every year raising nearly \$140,000 overall.

We're also excited to announce our newest campaign, which will help to upgrade our educational technology. Juggling our commitment to education excellence and stabilizing tuition fees can be quite challenging in this costly area, so we've introduced two great fundraising opportunities that will be earmarked for this campaign.

Changebowl is an app that creates a savings account for your virtual loose change by rounding up your credit card and debit card transactions to the nearest dollar. Available on Apple and Android devices, it is simple to use and easily enables you to donate that loose change straight to KHDS.

Dlyted is a way for you to instantly buy electronic gift cards to hundreds of merchants at <u>no extra cost to you</u>, and a percentage of each card will be donated to KHDS. Dlyted even allows you to <u>use your credit card</u> to purchase cards online! Some examples of available merchants are; Airbnb, Uber, Groupon, Amazon, and hundreds of others!

We encourage you all to participate in both of these campaigns, and to encourage your friends and family to do so as well. When joined together, our nickels and dimes will make a significant impact!

NAMES, NOT NUMBERS®: A MOVIE IN THE MAKING



KHDS has once again been selected to participate in the Names, Not Numbers Program. This program transforms the traditional study of the Holocaust

into an interactive program that involves survivors who lived through the history being taught.

8th grade students, under the direction of **Rabbi Dr. Mordechai Smolarcik**, have been engaging in serious, meaningful dialogue with the survivors and forging relationships with them. In addition, throughout the program, the students have been learning interviewing techniques, documentary film tools, and editing skills and have been working with professionals —journalists, newspaper editors, filmmakers, and Holocaust scholars.

KHDS is grateful for being chosen to participate in this project, which is generously supported by a prominent national foundation, and looks forward to sharing with our school community how this program impacts our students. A post-event wrap up of the documentary premiere, Names, Not Numbers[©]: A Movie in the Making, will be in the next issue of the Hillel Herald.

ONEGS BRING GENERATIONS TOGETHER




MAKERSPACE CLUB
