## A MESSAGE FROM THE HEAD OF SCHOOL AND PRESIDENT

Rabbi Jonathan Sacks wrote, in Will We Have Jewish Grandchildren?, "I received an invitation to lunch with the Prime Minister. At the same time, I received an invitation to take part in the opening ceremony of a new Jewish school in London. Both events were on the same day, at roughly the same time. I could not attend both. Which took precedence?... Governments sustain society, but education sustains the world. On that occasion I rearetfully declined the Prime Minister's invitation and opened the school." Education sustains the world because our children are our future. And it is not simply the knowledge that they acquire in school that maintains the

continuum of generations. Rather, it is the

values that are transmitted that create a strong foundation for generations to come.

At Katz Hillel Day School we continually strive for excellence in general and Judaic studies. But at the epicenter of our education are core values that we seek to imbue in every one of our students. We teach respect of self, others, and our environment. We develop compassion and a sense of charity amongst our students toward those who need our help. Our students learn to seek justice through their actions and be truthful in their daily engagements. We teach our students to become responsible and engaged members of our community, lovers and supporters of Medinat Yisrael and the United State of America. Our students gain a joy and love of lifelong learning that encourages them to pursue wisdom and understanding through Torah and general learning.

Most importantly, we teach that emunah (faith) in Hashem is the source of all blessings and should be actively present in our lives.

This past year, KHDS students paired with seniors at various local senior residences doing projects with them, sharing stories, learning from them, and performing for them. Our 8th graders once again made deep connections with Holocaust survivors by interviewing them and learning about the survivors' Holocaust experiences while recording these oral histories. Our students invested themselves in additional learning opportunities outside of school hours in programs such as Sunday morning learning, G.R.I.T. (Growing and Learning In Torah), and a Wednesday night Gemara class. More and more lower school students obtained E.M.E.T. badges as they continue to work on their middot both inside and outside of school. And, they did all of this while achieving and growing academically.

We know how well our alumni succeed in high school, college, and beyond. But we also know that, more importantly, they are imbued with the core values that we work so hard to cultivate both inside and outside the classroom at Katz Hillel Day School.

When you invest in our school and thereby our students' education, these are the values you are helping perpetuate for the next generation. Thank you for being part of this sacred charge. We cannot thank you enough for your incredible support!

## A MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR



On the day before Walt Disney passed away, a reporter found his way into his hospital room in Burbank, CA, determined to get an interview. Mr. Disney invited the reporter to lay next to him, because he was only able to speak in a whisper. At one point, Disney pointed to an imaginary map on the ceiling of the yet unbuilt Magic Kingdom theme park, while he described his vision for the park and the attractions in

great detail. At the opening of Walt Disney World six years later, someone asked CEO Mike Vance, "Isn't it too bad that Walt Disney didn't live to see this?" to which Vance replied, "He did see it. That's why it's here."

Over 30 years ago, a group of visionaries came together to share their image on the ceiling, which would become Katz Hillel Day School. It would be hard to believe that anyone could have foretold where KHDS would be after our first 30 years, with our growth, our campus, thousands of students, and our impact on their lives and on the community. Those pioneers, however, certainly did; and that's why we're here. Like Disney, they not only had and shared that vision, but they also led the way by pouring their time and resources into our success.

There is a well known story about President Kennedy's visit to the NASA space center in 1962. Along his tour, Kennedy stopped to introduce himself to a janitor carrying a broom, and asked what the man was doing. "Mr. President," he replied, "I'm helping put a man on the moon." This janitor recognized that it would take the contributions of thousands of people filling a variety of roles to achieve this historic feat, and he was one of those critical components.

Torah commentators famously debate the reasons why Avraham Avinu was greater than Noach. Rav Eliyahu Dessler explains that although Noach cared for the animals over the course of their year together in the ark, his kindness was merely reactive since he didn't want the animals to starve. Noach rebuked the wicked in his generation during the 120 years that it took to build the ark, but in all of that time, he never went the extra mile to inspire them to repent, seemingly getting by with just the bare minimum of effort. Avraham, on the other hand, was proactive by nature. He went to great lengths to seek opportunities to perform acts of kindness and spread the Torah and Hashem's oneness throughout the world. That characteristic was key to his greatness, and his legacy as the 'av hamon goyim'- the father of many nations.

It would have been difficult in 1989 to predict the challenges and opportunities that KHDS would face in our first three decades, just as we may not be able to predict what KHDS will look like in another 30 years, or the path we will take to get there. More than simply reaching the moon, we are aiming to change the course of generations and secure the eternity of Klal Yisrael, and a task of that magnitude will require the efforts of many people in many different roles. But we will have a new generation of pioneers to proactively assure that we fulfill our vision of what KHDS can be in 2049 and beyond, and I'm eager for you all to join our team.

## A MESSAGE FROM FINANCIAL RESOURCE **DEVELOPMENT**

We did it!!! We surpassed our increased Annual Campaign goal of \$700,000 - what an amazing achievement for our 30th Anniversary! And

each of our 2018-2019 donors played a part in helping us to meet and exceed this goal. How did we do it??

Our major fundraiser of the year, the 30th Anniversary **Annual Journal Dinner**, raised \$166,544 as we honored Rabbi Josh and Simone Broide on January 8, 2019. The event also paid tribute to Dr. Neal and Bonnie Weinreb, who received the Helen Cohan, z"l, Dor L'Dor Society Award, and seven faculty members were recognized for their long time dedication to KHDS. See the full review on page 12.

The **Annual Mega Raffle** brought in \$51,421 as donors tried their luck to win one of many prizes, including the \$100,000 grand prize, made possible by a collaboration of Torah institutions.

Over "Fore"-ty nine thousand dollars (\$49,000) was raised through our 5th Annual Parent-Child Golf Outing, held on May 19, 2019. See page 13 for the event in review and thank you to our generous sponsors.

General donations accounted for \$88,646 of our Annual Campaign, and of this, \$25,000 was awarded by a national foundation thanks to 8th grade student Ariella Mayer's winning essay from the Better2Write competition. Other general donations include tributes (in honor or in memory of a loved one), Changebowl (download the app to seamlessly donate your spare change), and the Koppie Cohn Day of Learning **Program** which is endowed in memory of *Menashe* Koppel Cohn, A"H, by the Cohn family and raised over \$6,000 for the 2018-2019 school year.

**Designated gifts** are those donations allocated for specific programs and innovative projects. This past year \$102,507 was raised to support programs like class trips (8th grade Israel Trip and 7th grade Washington, D.C. trip) as well as \$65,000 generously donated by the PTA for our state-of-the-art Makerspace. The Charles Scher Teacher's Discretionary Fund, initiated by the **Scher family**, also continues to grow and assist faculty in need of financial assistance.

The "lion"-share of scholarship support, however, comes from our Major Gifts Societies. This generous group of donors raised \$267,000 over the past year and just as a lion, they are pillars of strength in support of Jewish education. In appreciation of our most generous donors, we created the new Hillel Society, which recognizes cumulative lifetime gifts of over \$1 million. We also introduced the Menachem Begin Society, to promote lead gifts of \$100,000. And of course our staple societies: Lamed Vav, Chai, and Maimonides Societies, continue to grow. Our Every Parent Campaign (EPC) provides every KHDS family with the opportunity to donate and 'give back' to our school with a gift of tzedakah, regardless of their financial situation, as everyone is acknowledged equally. Every dollar counts and families can give any amount they feel comfortable with, based on their own personal circumstances. Any donation to the Annual Campaign or a designated gift qualifies. We also continue to grow our Dor L'Dor Society for grandparents who donate \$360+. Our Honor Roll, on pages 8-9, recognizes those generous grandparents who have supported the campaign.

All of these tzedakah opportunities benefit the scholarship fund of which over \$1.8 million is provided for families in need of scholarship assistance. It also allows KHDS to continue to maintain standards of excellence in all aspects of its educational programs.

Not all of our programs are based on donations though. The Scholar Society asks for your gift of "wisdom." Grandparents and community members can get involved while sharing their life and career experiences with KHDS students and make a direct impact on our future generations. Several Scholar Society speaking engagements were held throughout the year including our Inaugural Career Panel (see page 11).

After-lifetime giving is yet another important component to the longevity of our school. Our Atid **Legacy Society** now has 60 members (see page 7). We would like to acknowledge the Jacobson Jewish Community Foundation of the Jewish Federation of South Palm Beach County and the Harold Grinspoon **Foundation**, for sponsoring the Life & Legacy program over the past four years. This vital campaign has encouraged KHDS to focus on promoting planned giving, endowments and other after-lifetime giving opportunities so that we may continue to thrive and educate children for generations to come.

We are additionally grateful to the **Jewish Federation** of South Palm Beach County for their ongoing support in funding a portion of our general scholarship fund through the tuition assistance grant as well as through other grant opportunities.

Special thanks to Executive Director, Joe Sharp, for his time and resources in supporting the Development Office. His hard work on the Annual Raffle, soliciting major sponsors for our Golf Outing and Journal Dinner, and all of his time and assistance behind the scenes is so greatly appreciated. And in his spare time, Joe's involvement and efforts with Teach Florida and other organizations has resulted in increased scholarship aid, security funding and other substantial grants.

We also acknowledge **Dvora Scher** for her time and efforts in assisting the Development Office. Dvora is the Chair of the Dor L'Dor and Scholar Societies, and is an active member of our Life & Legacy Team. She is also offering free confidential consultations and a last will and testament, codicil and/or trust amendment, as well as other useful guidance about legacy planning. Dvora recognizes the importance of relationship building with our grandparents and community friends and we are thankful to have her as part of our team.







He noted that this year's graduates were the 13th class he and Morah Hadassah Smolarcik had escorted to Israel, and he thanked her for her steadfast enthusiasm each year. He recounted a time when many Syrian villagers fled into Israel and were welcomed with open arms, despite being at war. Mr. Katz noted that the instinct of Israelis to extend help and welcome to the very people with whom they were at war should serve as an example to the graduates of how helping others in need is always the right thing to do.

Judah Frohlich explained that this year's Yearbook was dedicated to the memory of their beloved, inspirational and uniquely witty teacher Mrs. Dannie Grajower, z"l. Ariella Mayer then thanked her fellow graduates, on behalf of all the editors, noting that they had enjoyed learning so much from their peers. Finally, Rebecca Adler thanked by name an extensive and varied list of students, faculty, staff and administrators who had helped take the Yearbook from a collection of ideas to the beautiful hardcover volume that each graduate will treasure for a lifetime.
