Please read through the following information about scholarships available to families with **income-based** or **educational-based** needs.



## **Tuition Assistance funding for students in EC2-8**

Katz Hillel Day School grants over **\$1,800,000** in tuition assistance each year to families in need. To apply, all families must submit their financial information to FACTS Grant & Aid Assessment, after which it will be reviewed with strict confidentiality by our committee. Tuition Assistance is limited, and applicants will be reviewed in the order in which they were received. Applications will only be reviewed once all supporting documentation is received.



## **FES & FTC: Income-Based Scholarship through the State of Florida - For students K-8**

The Florida Legislature created the income-based Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program (FTC) to help low-income families. These scholarships are based on financial need, and have **very limited availability**.

Both **Step Up for Students** and **AAA Scholarship** administer these scholarships, and it is important that you **apply through each of them**, as it is very common to be rejected by one and accepted by the other.

**It is mandatory for any family requesting financial aid awards to first apply to Step Up for Students and AAA Scholarship on time.**

**If you received an FTC or FES for the 21/22 school year, you don't need to reapply for the 22/23 school year**

Children must turn 4 on or before Sept. 1 of the current school year to be eligible for the VPK program. Enrollment in this program through KHDS will lower your EC4 tuition by \$2,150.

For students 3 years old through 12th grade with disabilities **including, but not limited to:**

- \* Anaphylaxis
- \* Autism spectrum disorder
- \* Down syndrome
- \* Intellectual disability
- \* Dual sensory impaired
- \* 3, 4, or 5 year-olds deemed high-risk due to developmental delays

(Requires an IEP written in accordance with the rules of the Board of Ed. of any state OR the diagnosis of a U.S. licensed physician or psychologist.)

## McKay Scholarship

- Have been enrolled & reported for funding in a Florida public school during the preceding October & February Florida Education Finance Program surveys;
- **or** Have been a pre-kindergarten student who was reported as having received Specialized Instructional Services by the Office of Early Learning and was at least 4 years old;
