"The two most important days of your life are the day you are born and the day you find out why." – Mark Twain



This was the quote that followed Chayim's signature on every email.

On June 19, 2021, we lost our beloved friend, colleague and Principal, *Mr. Chayim Dimont*, *Z''L*.

Chayim began his KHDS journey on June 1, 1999, when he was hired as the Director of Early Childhood. As **Rabbi Kenneth Brander** noted in his eulogy, "Chayim was a dreamer with an implementation strategy." Over the years he professionalized the EC program and expanded his role through 3rd grade as Principal. Over the course of his 22year KHDS tenure, he inspired thousands of children. His constant dedication and passion for education kept Chayim right where he wanted to be — with the children.

What makes the KHDS family so special is that we are blessed with leaders in our family who have devoted their lives to making our school a Makom Torah. Chayim was clearly one of these people. He guided and inspired with his loving heart and soul. His fundraising efforts built Aunt Jessie's playground. His love for theatrics and creativity brought endless fun. His Purim and play costumes brought laughs. His fireworks shows brought ruach. His Teddy Bear Day brought cuddly surprises. His daily EMET winner announcements echoed the halls of the elementary school. His carpool protocol was like a Broadway production (much like the quality of the end of year KTP performance that he always proudly presented). He was literally KHDS' biggest celebrity.

But that fun was also wrapped in hard work, countless hours of planning, learning and growing, and always being honest and present. He rallied through this year's Kindergarten graduation and then the 8th grade graduation of his youngest son, Ezra, as his final KHDS milestone. Although Chayim treated his KHDS family like blood relatives, his true love was (and is) for his wife **Michele** and children, **Albert** (KHDS Class of '16), **Orly** (KHDS Class of '19) and **Ezra** (KHDS Class of '21). We wish the Dimont family much strength at this difficult time and keep them in our thoughts daily.

Chayim, we miss you immensely.

HOLOCAUST DOCUMENTARY PROGRAM BRINGS STUDENTS & SURVIVORS TOGETHER

KHDS was selected to participate in the Names, Not Numbers[®] Program, which transforms the traditional study of the Holocaust into an interactive program that involves survivors who lived through the history being taught.

The 8th grade students, under the direction of **Rabbi Dr. Mordechai Smolarcik** and **Rabbi Ari Mirzoeff**, engaged in serious, meaningful dialogue with the survivors and forged relationships with them. In addition, through the program, the students learned interviewing techniques, documentary film tools, and editing skills. Throughout the program, the students worked with professionals journalists, newspaper editors, filmmakers, and Holocaust scholars.

LIGHTS, CAMERA, ACTION: DOCUMENTARY PREMIERES LIVE

KHDS gratefully acknowledges the Names, Not Numbers[®] Program, which has taught our students about the Holocaust through the accounts of eyewitnesses, and provided them with interviewing, filming and editing skills. Most importantly, the program enabled the survivors and our students to forge meaningful relationships. The program transformed the traditional study of the Holocaust and we have benefited tremendously through our participation in this project.

On Tuesday, May 25th, over 500 participants tuned in via Zoom for the YouTube world premiere of the documentary film. The film chronicled the lives of seven Holocaust survivors, as well as the personal experiences of the KHDS 8th grade students who worked for months on this project under the direction of faculty coordinators, **Rabbi Dr. Mordechai Smolarcik** and **Rabbi Ari Mirzoeff**. We also acknowledge our videographers **Lou Aguilar** and **Carlos Sanfer**, and film editor **Drew Aldridge**, who worked with the students throughout the project.
